Person-Directed Employment Supports for Autistic Adults





Course Overview

The Person-Directed Employment Supports for Autistic Adults training course is a self-paced training course for employment service providers to learn more about autism and person-directed supports.

This course will explore various person-directed approaches that career professionals can use in supporting Autistic people in an employment context.

Who Should Take the Course?

This course is designed for career practitioners, employment support practitioners, job developers, and case managers within the supported employment landscape across Canada.

Course Objectives

In this course you will learn:

- How to define person-directed supports.
- The difference between person-directed and person-centred approaches.
- Approaches that can be applied when working with Autistic individuals in the employment landscape.
- First-voice, autistic perspectives on supports that have worked for them.

Evaluation Process

This course contains a knowledge check at the end.

These questions serve as a summative assessment of the learner's knowledge of the content provided in the three modules.

100 percent will need to be achieved to complete the course.

Questions will prompt the learner to retry if answered incorrectly.


Upon successfully completing the course (all 3 modules), there is a printable certificate for your records.
